On May 8, Jason Greene celebrated his first anniversary as Chief Executive Officer (CEO) with Myrtle Beach Downtown Alliance. We asked Jason to share a recap of his first year and forecast of plans for downtown Myrtle Beach.

"Over the past year, we have made significant strides in enhancing our internal operations and expanding our network of institutional relationships. By developing a flexible operational model, we are now better equipped to collaborate with both current and future partners. A key achievement was the creation of a long-term strategic plan focused on three core experiences: residential, scenic and episodic, and lifestyle. This plan aims to cater to diverse community needs and ensure a dynamic, inclusive, and engaging environment for all.

To shape this vision, we engaged in numerous stakeholder and community input meetings, gathering valuable insights and fostering a sense of shared ownership in our developmental goals. These discussions have been instrumental in guiding our initiatives and ensuring they resonate with community aspirations. Concurrently, we initiated work on comprehensive design guidelines for our downtown area, encompassing various elements such as





thematic options and public art, architecture, lighting, and neighborhood and district identities. Our focus also includes park and street improvements, storytelling, branding, wayfinding, and the integration of smart city technology. These guidelines are intended to create a cohesive and vibrant downtown that is both functional and visually appealing.

Hurricane Season Begins June 1

2024 Hurricane Evacuation Zones Updated for Myrtle Beach

As we gear up for the 2024 hurricane season, residents in Myrtle Beach are preparing for potential storms with a renewed focus on safety and preparedness. One significant change this year is the update to Myrtle Beach's hurricane zones, aimed at enhancing evacuation procedures and ensuring the safety of everyone in the area.

In recent years, there has been an increase in the unpredictability and intensity of hurricanes, underscoring the importance of proactive measures. The adjustment of hurricane zones is a proactive step taken by South Carolina Emergency Management Department (SCEMD), Horry County Emergency Management and City of Myrtle Beach Emergency Management to better align evacuation routes and procedures with the evolving risk landscape.

So, what exactly are these changes?

Understanding the Updates:

Myrtle Beach's hurricane zones are revised based on updated flood maps, storm surge projections, and other relevant data. These revisions are aimed at accurately identifying areas most susceptible to the impacts of hurricanes, including storm surge, flooding, and high winds.

By delineating these zones more precisely, authorities can tailor evacuation orders and safety guidelines to better suit the needs of specific communities. As a resident, knowing the hurricane zone for home and work are crucial for understanding the level of risk and the necessary steps to take in the event of an approaching storm.

Navigating Evacuation Routes:

With the updated hurricane zones comes a renewed emphasis on evacuation routes. The updated evacuation routes were selected to ensure the smooth flow of traffic and the safety of evacuees.

It's essential for everyone in Myrtle Beach to familiarize themselves with the evacuation routes corresponding to their respective hurricane zones. Whether evacuating by car or public transportation, knowing the most efficient routes can make all the difference in ensuring a timely and safe evacuation.

Finding Your Zone:

The City of Myrtle Beach, Horry County and the South Carolina Emergency Management Department provide interactive tools on their official websites that enable residents and visitors to input their address and instantly discover their designated hurricane zone. This user-friendly tool is invaluable for planning and preparedness, allowing individuals to take proactive measures well in advance of any impending storms.
